History of Character Education and PBIS at Independence Elementary

- 2003-The Independence Elementary Character Education program began with a Word of the Month Program.
- 2004-Character Education Committee was formed to be more strategic in our initiatives.
- 2006-Adopted our 4 Core Value Words: RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY, HONESTY, FRIENDSHIP (words that would later be the building blocks of our Expectations Matrix)
- Worked closely with CharcterPLUS to receive training and build on our strengths and areas of growth

History of Character Education and PBIS at Independence (cont.)

- 2012-Started PBIS Tier 1 Training. Character Education and PBIS committees combined to create the SAIL team.
- Same year several student leadership teams were created.
- 2013-Applied and was awarded the State and National School of Character
- More student leadership teams were created
- 2015-Started PBIS Tier 2 Training

- 3. I know, understand, and can model the 4 core value words.
- 4. I am learning about Character Education at my school.

Student Survey Process

- Survey Monkey link
- Survey Questions include:
 - I feel safe at my school.
 - My school is a good place to learn.
 - I like going to this school.
 - Adults in my school care about me.
 - In the last year, have you ever been bullied at school.
 - I set and monitor academic goals.
- 2nd-5th Grade students were surveyed in the Learning Commons.
- Survey results were shared with students and staff. Results will be shared with parents in the fall.
