### What is SW-PBS?

Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports is an approach to discipline that helps achieve both social and academic success. It is a proactive way to systematically teach and respond to behavior in a positive and consistent way and providing supports and interventions as need-

There are three main components of SW-PBS.

- 1. Defining and teaching the expected behavior
- 2. Practicing the behavior
- 3. Reinforcing the appropriate Behavior


