PD vs. PL

- The term professional development (PD) is commonly used to describe support services for educators. PD is often describing a single event such as face-to-face training only.
- MO SW-PBS proposes that schools instead provide all stakeholders with professional learning (PL), which encompasses a systematic process of support for everyone. PL can include face-to-face training, observation, coaching, resource banks of materials, communication plans, virtual supports, etc.

Providing quality professional learning to your staff will be important in ensuring that SW-PBS is implemented with fidelity.


