LiveBinders offers school leaders the opportunity to create, store and share important information with staff on a web-based system

LVE uses LiveBinders to organize PBIS data, training information, schedules/calendars, lessons, videos, etc.

Users can create various tabs within each Binder

Use “live links” within the Binder allows for documents, presentations, etc. to update automatically

LVE Character Safari



As we begin each school year, all LVE Lions travel on a great safari!

Students travel the halls of Lakeview Elementary on a Safari to explore and understand our School-Wide Expectations

There are 8 stops along the Character Safari; one for each area of the school

Each place has important expectations to remember that will help to make our school a great place to be!

Character Safari License

Once each class has completed the entire safari, learned and practiced the expectations at each location, they earn a SAFARI LICENSE.

Each class will display our license to show their great accomplishment.

We will also have a poster to show how we are meeting school expectations

“Lion Experts”: If students master and are showing that they can meet the expectations time after time, their Lion sticker will be in the “Lions Experts” column.

“Cubs in Training”: However, if students are needing reminders to meet expectations, they will work as a class to improve while moving our Lion sticker to “Cubs in Training”

Technology on the Safari-QR Codes

While at each location, students find a few treasures.

Each location has a “QR code” at each of our stops on safari.

Using a tablet/Smart device, students and teachers scan the QR code and find a message about the location.

Once we have met the expectations for the location, we will sign our class name on the paw print poster.



Using Videos to Model SW Expectations

Create short video clips to model and show students school-wide expectations

Videos are linked in LiveBinder under the PBIS tab

Students and teachers view the video during the annual “Character Safari” at the beginning of the school year and as needed throughout the year (refreshers)

Use “student actors” to model and demonstrate expected behaviors in various areas of school

Vimeo, Wondershare WeVideo, iPhone, iPad are easy to use video and editing resources

Use videos to show students how to shop in the school store



LVE currently has 28 staff members with active Twitter accounts

“Hats Off to You”



LVE Administrator student recognition program called “Hats Off to You”

Each day two teachers are selected to recognize one student in their class

Teachers write a few sentences about why he/she is recognizing the student;
use a shared Google Doc

Both students are called to the office at the end of the day

Principal makes positive phone call home and reads the teachers comments

Students and administrator take selfie with various hats & other props

Selfie picture and description is “tweeted” out
