




Conquering Tier 1 While in the Jungle of Multiple Interventions

How and why we began the journey (2006-2007)

- Worked Backwards...
- Began RTI went to visit Lewis Elementary in Excelsior Springs
- Impressed by seeing their SWPBS in action
- Went back and shared with staff and met with RPDC person
- We had 100% buy in...VERY important

Why did we decide to do it?

Wanted consistency throughout the building with expectations and consequences

How did we get buy-in?

Sharing what we saw at Lewis Elementary

Everyone looking for help with changing demographics

Beginning SWPBS while doing RTI

We really emphasized to staff that SWPBS is to behavior what RTI is to academics.

We were fortunate that RTI did not place too much extra work on the classroom teacher which made for an easier transition into SWPBS.

Creating the Clippard SWPBS Team

- Wanted representation from each grade level
- Asked for a volunteer from each grade and encore
- Asked for 2 people who would be our fearless leaders

Planning Year (2010-2011)

Summer Training (2 days): Purpose statement, GRR, began matrix, setting up regular meeting times twice a month

Purpose: At Clippard Elementary SWPBS is designed to create a caring and positive learning environment with students and staff who are safe, respectful, and responsible.

Continuously worked on matrix and took back to the staff after each area was decided to get approval.

Then had whole staff help create lesson plans.

Techniques to Manage Minor Behaviors

- Proximity control
- · Signal/Non-verbal cue
- Ignore, Attend, Praise

If these don't work....THEN use these strategies...

Instructional Reponses to Inappropriate Behavior

This is a continuum/progression

- Re-direct
- Ask the four questions (on back)
- · Re-teach
- Provide choice
- Student conference

Still not working? (Send to buddy room if appropriate)

- Fill out minor referral (blue)
- Parent contact if child was removed from class & sent to buddy room.
- · Determine consequences.

If inappropriate behavior still continues...

- Write a major referral.
 Take referral to office.
- · Contact the parents.
- Teacher and administrator determine consequences.

Majors

Ensure safety of students, if necessary.

Write major referral (yellow slip) and take to office.

- Follow through with consequences given.
- Call home to parents.
- The teacher who writes referral will call home unless it was an assistant or para.

Implementation Year...The year of CHANGE!!!

- Training staff before first day of school
- Each staff member received a binder with matrix, lessons, t-shirt, lanyard, and tickets
- Divided up the staff into groups and SWPBS Team taught rest of staff - Punch Card, Video

2011-2012 School Year...Day 1

- Teachers wore shirts
- Had a kick-off assembly to introduce SWPBS to students
- Schedule of when to teach lesson plans -RTI time, rotation
- Posted GRR signs in classrooms and around school



Throughout the first year

Revising, revising, revising

- First shopping day...one cart not enough
- Splitting binder of certificates into multiple binders
- Class tickets exceeding our 200 ceiling
- Reteaching expectations at beginning of second semester
- Beginning in February, expectation of the week
- Made a new flow chart that was easier to follow
- Made slideshow of expectations and students modeling

 Students who are always good not having as many tickets as those who aren't always good
