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








What is PBS?

- SW-PBS is a process for creating safer and more effective schools by structuring the learning environment to support the academic and social success of all students.
- The process supports the adoption and long-term implementation for efficient and effective discipline throughout the school environment.
- SW-PBS methods are research-based, proven to significantly reduce the occurrence of problem behaviors in schools and supported by a three-tiered model.

7 Essential Components of PBS

- Administrative support, participation, and leadership
- Common purpose and approach to discipline
- Clear set of positive expectations and behaviors
- Procedures for teaching expected behavior
- Continuum of procedures for encouraging expected behavior
- Continuing of procedures for discouraging inappropriate behavior
- Procedures for ongoing monitoring


