Each Staff member will have a PAW placed outside of their door. Staff members will accumulate stamps on their paw

15 Stamps equals "Tiger Pride" Pullover!



Staff Paw Stamps earned for:

- Give out your golden ticket 3 times in a row (cumulative)- 1 stamp

PBS "Tiger Pride" Recognition Teacher Reference

Class Character Competition = C3 Award

- Attendance will be tracked by the office for individual teachers for a designated hour each month.
- Weekly updates will be emailed out to all teachers and announced over the intercom during ELT.
- Attendance percentages will be based on the attendance codes entered into PowerSchool.
- The hour used for the competition will change each month.
- Criteria: The class with the highest attendance percentage at the end of the month for the designated hour will receive a reward.
- Recognition: Popsicles during that class period or a chill room- up to teachers discretion

Celebrity Club 200

- · Golden tickets are given to staff members
- · Staff is on the lookout for students following "Tiger Pride" code
- · Students who receive a ticket take the ticket to the office and draw a chip
- Students name goes on the "Celebrity board"
- Recognition: Once a "BINGO"- 15 squares- hit the board those student receive a special activity and or prize
- Weekly-A name will be drawn from the board and that student will receive a prize

Louie Loot

- Teachers give out Louie Loot whenever they see positive behavior at any timeclassroom, hallway, and commons.
- Students collect Louie Loot to use in the Lucky Louie Store
 - The Lucky Louie Store is located directly across from Mr. Spallo's office
- Prizes are displayed and have a price value starting at 1 Louie Loot dollars
- Students will be able to "shop" on Wednesdays from 7:00-7:20 and 1:27-1:45 and during lunch

SUBway Plan

- A substitute teacher may give students a sub token for showing positive Tiger Pride throughout the day they are here
- Students will then turn the tokens in during lunch
- At the end of the month 15 names will be drawn and those 15 students will receive a subsandwich for lunch
