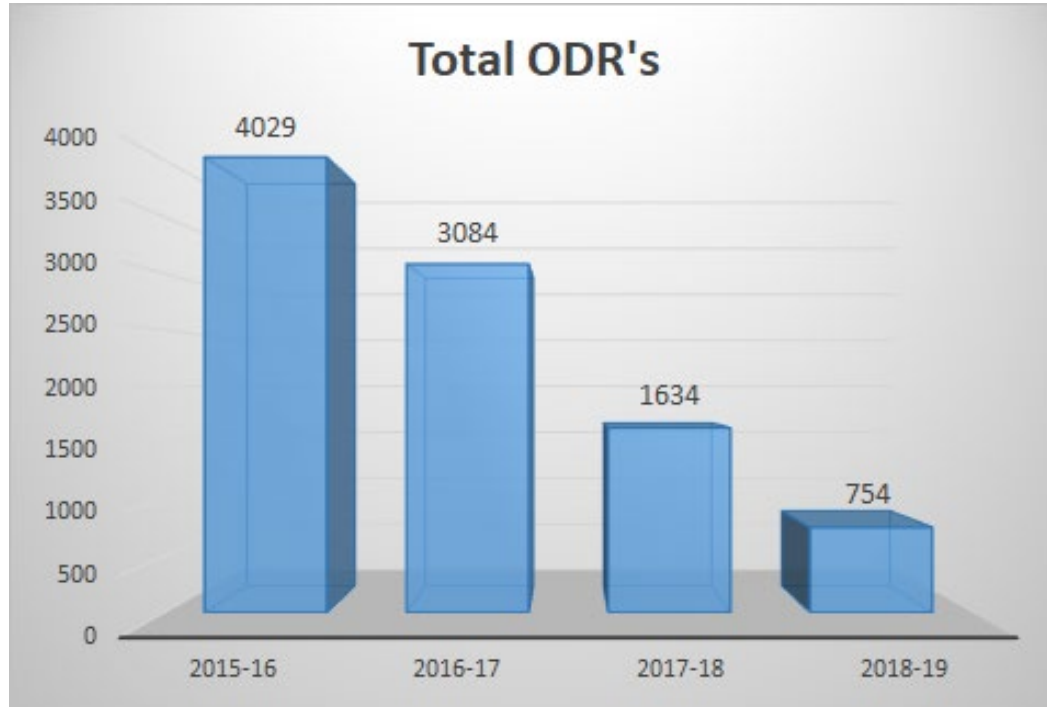

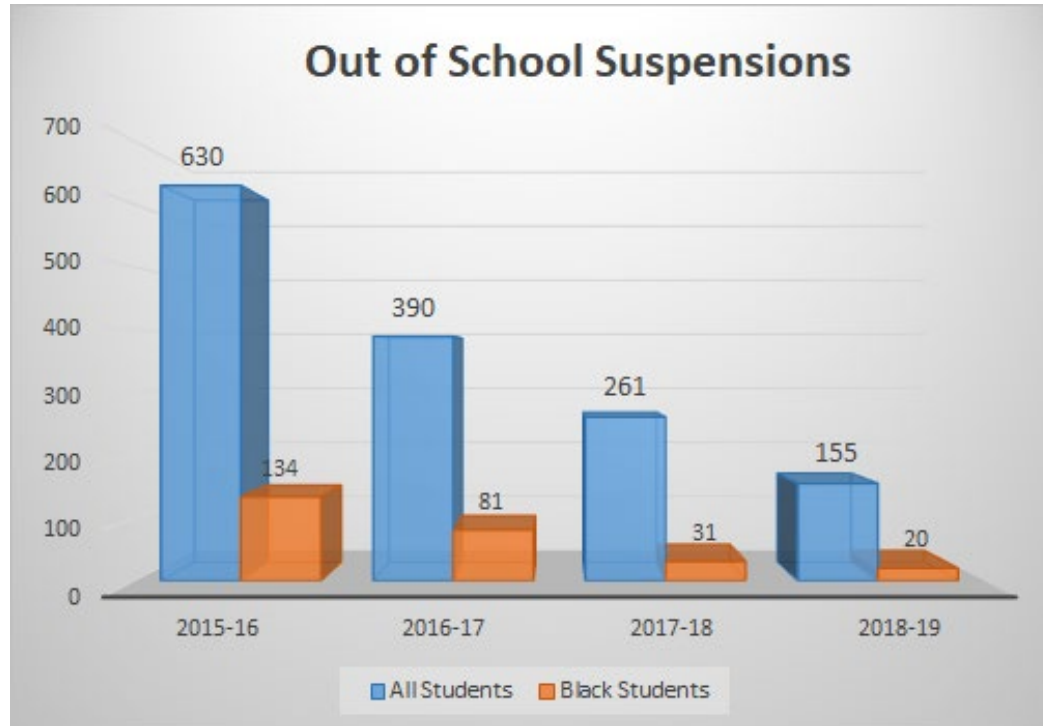
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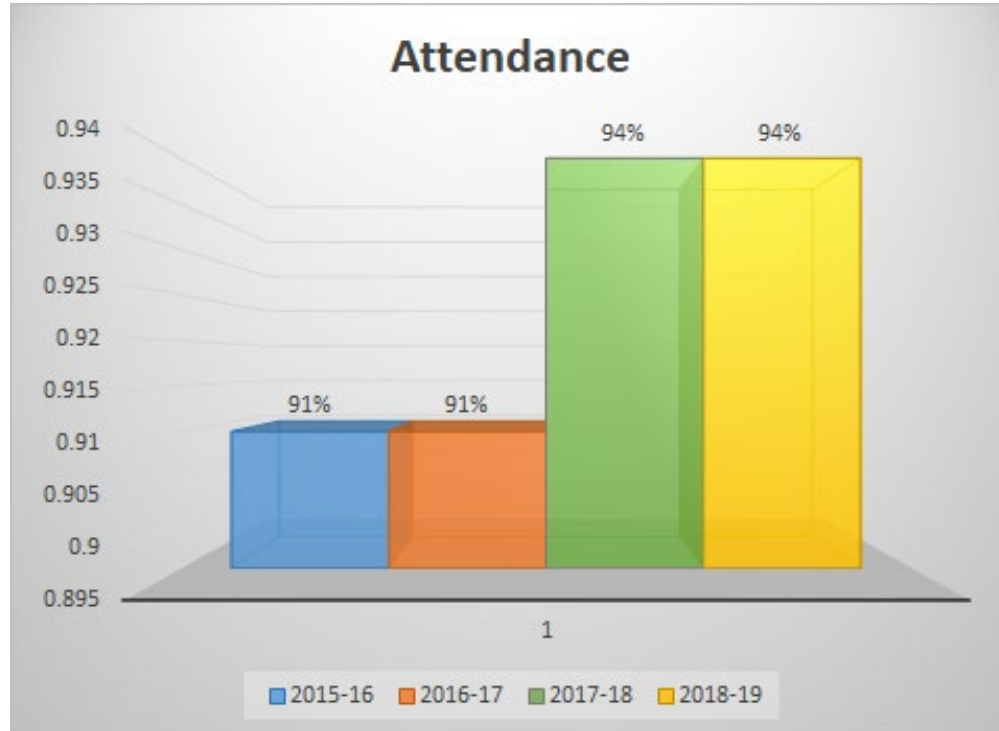
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# Refocus Room

## Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus

### Why/Need for Refocus Room



- To keep kids in school
- Give students opportunity to be taught critical life skill of self - regulation
- For teachers to have a place to send dysregulated students when learning environment is disrupted
- To support teachers with a plan for those students who need extra support



# Refocus Room

## Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus

- Correct behavior calmly and in a manner that demonstrates that the student is safe and supported at school.
- View inappropriate behavior as an instructional opportunity; reteach expectations and allow the student to practice expected behavior.
- Use consequences that promote student self-reflection
- Communicate the importance of instructional time; correct student behavior and return them to the instructional setting as quickly as possible.

# Refocus Room

## Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus

### Purpose of Refocus Room

- Provides a *restorative process* for students who violate school rules/policy
- Helps student recover and return to learning
- Provides structure and support by holding students accountable to their actions while given them space in a supportive way
- Gives students what they need



# Refocus Room

**Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus**

## Triage

The goal is for staff to take pulse of building in the 30 minutes to assess the mood of individual students - Students are brought down to the Refocus Room if/when they are seen to need intervention. This provides a private space for their needs to be met.



# Refocus Room

## Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus

How does a student get to Refocus Room:

- When a disruption to the learning environment occurs:
  - PBIS- Teachers use Tier 1 and 2 interventions prior to referral (seat changes, proximity, 3:1, refocus in buddy classroom)
  - If the teacher cannot successfully get the student back on track after implementing Tier 1 and 2 interventions, a referral to the Refocus Room is made
  - Online referral form-
  - Phone call to Refocus Room (if form cannot be filled out right away)

# Refocus Room

Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus

The Refocus Room is NOT

- Used for minor/major office referrals
- A time out room
- A play room
- A place to escape from class without having to be held accountable
- A place to get treats and rewards



# Refocus Room

## Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus

### What happens in the Refocus Room

- Students reflect on mistakes;
- With guidance, students find ways to improve Behavior;
- Interactions with caring and trusted adults



# Refocus Room

## Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus

### Set up of room (dynamics of adults in Refocus Room Suite)

- Principles of mindfulness;
  - Non-judging
  - Beginner's Mind
  - Non-striving
  - Accepting
  - Patience
  - Trust
  - Letting go
- Furniture
- Music
- Soft lighting





# Refocus Room

**Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus**

## Process for Using the Refocus Room

- Greeting Students
- Assessing Needs
- Filling out form
- Behavior 360 (Web Program for Social and Emotional Learning, Character Development, and Intervention/Restorative Justice)
- Return to Class



# Refocus Room

## Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus

### Greeting students

As students enter:

- some will receive a verbal greeting ;
- while others will require a thumbs up or other non-verbal greeting.

This will depend on the emotional state of the student. There are some students who come in a heightened state and verbal greetings elevate this.

It is up to the adult in the room to be able to determine the needs of each student as they arrive.

It is very important that every student be greeted upon arrival. We want them to feel welcomed and invited.



# Refocus Room

## Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus

### Assessing the need

Once students are in the room:

- Fill out a reflection form with the goal of them returning to class within 5 minutes.
- Other students will need more time to process and reflect.

The adult in the room needs to look for things like:

- Body language,
- Breathing,
- Facial expressions,
- Tone of voice, etc.

There are couches in the room provided for students who need time to cool off and regroup before being expected to fill out the reflection form.

# Refocus Room

## Behavior 360- District Pilot



Incorporating Behavior 360 into our practice is one way we are attempting to do this. We are turning discipline into learning by providing students with opportunities to grow from their infractions.

Sample topics: intolerance, bullying, truancy, aggression, disrespect, self-discipline, strong emotions, anger management, etc.

# Refocus Room

## Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus

### Other uses for the room:

- Quiet Lunch
- Place to get work done for those who are distracted in classroom setting
- Structured/scheduled breaks as written in BSP (Behavior Support Plans) and 504 plans
- Space for teachers/students to mediate
- Foster Grandparent Program Partnership
- Cougar Closet



# Refocus Room

## Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus

### Restorative Practice

- Repairing damaged relationship between students
- Repairing damaged relationships between teacher and student (from perspective of student)

“The researchers found that the more teachers immersed themselves in restorative practices, the better students rated their relationships with these teachers.”

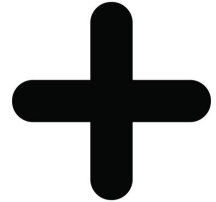
# Refocus Room

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What have we learned?

## Positives

- Removing disruptions allows learning to continue
- Allowing students a safe place to express their thoughts and feelings
- Providing teachers with alternate location to send disruptive students



# Refocus Room

## Creating a safe environment for restoration and refocus

What have we learned?

### Barriers

- Many staff still feel it's a reward/escape
- Students who return to class and repeat behavior
- Overuse by staff- dependent on room as first means
- Maturity level of some students -not taking it seriously
