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OVERVIEW

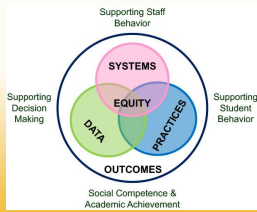
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RELEVANCE

- Implementation at the classroom level is critical to achieving and sustaining desired outcomes.
- Historically, implementation of effective universal classroom practices is low.
- Teacher self-efficacy is dropping.
- Teacher turnover is rising, alarmingly.

- **Universal Supports in ALL Schools**
- **Effective Classroom Practices**
 - Behavior Specific Praise (BSP)
 - Precorrection
 - Opportunities to Respond (OTR)
 - Active Supervision

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EQUITY

- Systemize onboarding for new administrators
- Differentiate administrator learning cycles
- Organize the data at a school and district level
- Build internal capacity
- Continue messaging that “evaluation” is opportunity for growth

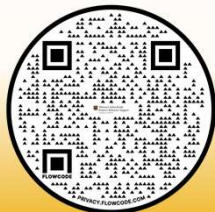

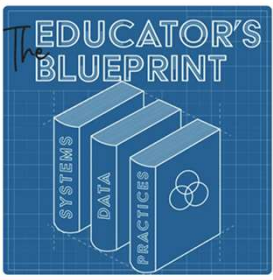
