## How is it Working?



Data for 23-24 School Year is current as of April 11, 2024.

22-23 23-24

2022-2023 referrals from the playground made up almost 25\% of our total, and the cafeteria referrals made up $7.6 \%$ of our total. This year, our playground referrals are about $16 \%$ of the total and the cafeteria referrals are just over 5\%.

## Reflections

- Develop a tracking system for completed charts
- Track how many stickers at the end of each quarter for quarterly winner.
- Have a prize/shoutout person
- Keep track of prizes given to each class
- Helps avoid duplicating reward too often.

## Quarterlu School-wide Incentives

First implemented during the 2022-2023 school year.
Things we had to consider this year.

- Teachers wanted incentives and assemblies on same day.
- Teachers asked for a schedule that did not disrupt our specials/recess schedule too much.
We needed to determine who would plan the incentives and who would supervise students.


## Quarterly School-wide Incentives

Each quarter students who qualify have 30 minutes of incentive time with other students in their grade level.

- Systems team chooses four activities each quarter.
- A teacher from each grade level hosts one of the activities.
- Students sign up for the activity they want to participate in during the incentive.
- Ideas have included: drawing/art, free tech, board games, BINGO, dance party, reading, etc.


## Quarterlu School-wide Incentives

Criteria:
Students either participate the entire 30 minutes or they participate the last 15 minutes.
$\square$ Full Participation.
$\square$ Students with 0-4 referrals for the quarter according to SWIS.
$\square$ Reduced Participation
$\square$ Students with 5 or more referrals for the quarter according to SWIS.
