


Tasks

Teacher Teams

- Tier 1 met once a month. Tier 2 and 3 met every three weeks.
- Analyze Behavior Data, Design the intervention, Evaluate the PBIS program, Bring new ideas and strategies

Students Team

- Met twice a month
- Organizing celebrations, bringing ideas, and mentoring students.
- Introduce new initiatives





Classroom Behavioral Expectations

The Viking Way: Be Respectful, Be Responsible & Be Safe

Expectation	All Settings	Classroom
Be Respectful	 Follow directions the first time Use appropriate language Take care of property Treat everyone with dignity and respect 	 Listen when others are talking Respect others work Leave property the way you found it
Be Responsible	 Take responsibility for actions/behavior Keep voice volume to a reasonable level Be a positive leader for other students Follow the dress code 	Attend school each day and come prepared Be in assigned seat on time Complete and submit all work on time
Be Safe	Resolve conflict peacefully Maintain personal space Report unsafe situations and conditions	 Keep feet and chair on floor at all times Keep personal belongings stored safely Use material the way it is intended Stay seated until the dismissal bell





Tier 1 Intervention – All Students

Teachers Implement

- 1. SEL lessons implementation
- 2. Advisory Building Relationships
- 3. Advisory Academic Support





Students Receive

- 1. Academic Promotion Honors' Day A and B grade Students
- 2. Acknowledging PositiveBehavior- Viking Star Awards –Teachers Nominate Students
- 3. Acknowledging Positive Attendance Reward all students who are 80% and above

Tiered Intervention Decision

Tier 2

- Review/ Analyze our ISS and suspension data
- Review teachers' referrals
- Teachers'/ Students' Surveys
- Students with less than 2 or 4 suspensions or referrals are part of this preventive intervention

Tier 3

- Review/ Analyze our ISS and suspension data
- Review teachers' referrals
- Students with multiple suspensions or referrals are part of this preventive intervention

Tier 2 Intervention Small Group Intervention

Mentor/Mentee (Check in Check Out)

- The mentor/mentee program has built positive relationships between teachers and struggling students.
- The mentor focuses on the individual student's needs and goals.
- When students experience a small success then their motivation increases for more positives and more success. This was referred to as the "Circle of Success".

Study Skill

- Based on the survey students received once a week small group study skill strategies
- Organization and Time Management
- Focus
- Memorization
- Motivation
- Note Taking
- Test Taking Strategies

Tier 3 Intervention

Self Behavior Monitoring

- 1. Completed by the students
- 2. Goal Setting, Track and Record your behavior
- 3. Self-Reflection, Feedback, and Reinforcement

Behavior Intervention Goals

- 1. Completed by the teachers
- 2. Define target behavior and set goals
- 3. Set intervention and accommodation
- 4. Data collection and monitor




Our Challenges
