

## Session Outcomes

Attendees will learn how we evaluate school-wide data to determine behavior focus needs and how lessons are developed and implemented to meet those needs.

Attendees will learn about the different ways that we celebrate and incentivize positive behaviors within our school.

Attendees will have the opportunity to collaborate, plan, and ask questions about our processes.

## Summary

Are you looking for ways to help teach behaviors within your school and celebrate the success and growth of your students? Then this is the presentation for you! In this session, you will learn how our team analyzes data to determine behavior needs of our school, and how lessons are developed and implemented school-wide to address those needs. We will also provide different ways that we celebrate and incentivize these areas of focus when they are met by our students. You will have time to collaborate with fellow colleagues on how you can implement this in your school and share ways that you focus on behaviors. We are all learners and want to hear from you as well!

We will use WICOR strategies such as think-pair-share, hand-up/pair-up, give-one/get-one to provide opportunities to collaborate.

## Where are we?

We are one of 4 middle schools in the Independence School District. Fun Fact: We are the MIDDLE of 3 middle schools sharing one campus.

## Who are we?

We are $a^{7 / 8}$ building housing between 750-800 students each year. We have 10 feeder elementary schools and we are the feeder school for one of our 3 high schools. Around $75 \%$ free and reduced lunch.

## What are our challenges?

New staff numbers, transient students, post-COVI struggles like attendance, parent involvement in activities (we are not a neighborhood school)

## Bingham is the MIDDLE of 3 middle schools on our campus.





Students sit back-to-back with their partner with their marker board and marker (in a group of 3 , the third person selects one of their two teammates to be their partner for the game and still sits back-to-back).

The teacher reads the slide topic to the entire class and then reads each of the 3 categories for the topic one at a time.

Students write an item that fits each category on their marker board.

When all 3 categories have been used, the teacher will say "Compare Answers" and students will compare with their partners and award themselves 1 point for each matching answer.
