SEL IS HIP-HOP CULTURE

The 5 competencies of SEL include: Self-Awareness, Self-Management, Social Awareness, Responsible Decision Making and Relationship Skills. Rooted in the African traditions of the griot and the drum, hip-hop began in the South Bronx as a form of personal expression and reaction to the systemically created intolerable socio-economic conditions that African-American and Hispanic people faced in the South Bronx. As an art form of expression, hip-hop embodies the 5 SEL competencies through the 5 elements of hip-hop.
