- We are around 45% Free and Reduced Lunch
- Class Sizes average 17-21 Students per class

#### Setting Up Success

- In the SUS team we go over all of the minor data. We look at where
- the problems may be occurring, at what times, which grade levels, and which students (is it repeat offenders or more individual students.)
   Then we come up with a plan on how to reduce/solve the problem behaviors. We pick the most concerning and set a goal based off of this.

- Comprised of a staff member from each grade level, special area teacher, support staff





### Tier 2 Our Mission

Our Tier 2 Team is dedicated to provide very targeted support for our students who are not successful with Tier 1 support alone.

Currently we have approximately 2% of our elementary students on some type of Tier 2 intervention.





## The Tier 2 Team

Our team is comprised of 11 committee members. All members have PBS experience and training and include both new and veteran educators. Members include 4 teachers (general, special ed, and special area), 2 administrators (special ed. and building), a math and reading interventionist, process coordinator and instructional coach.





## Tier 2 Roles & Responsibilities

Each member has very specific roles and responsibilities.

Facilitator (2)
Data Collectors (4)
Note-Taker (1)
Communicator (1)
Intervention Coordinator (2)
Time Keeper (1)

- Driven by a timed and detailed agenda





## Tier 2 Agenda Topics

Every meeting involves at least one of the agenda topics:

- Celebrations
- Students Currently on Interventions
- New Nominations
- Criteria Measures
- Universal Screener: SAEBRS





## **Tier 2** New Nominations

This meeting will determine the function of behavior and what intervention will benefit the student.

- The Tier 2 Team makes every effort to meet within 48 hours of receiving the nomination.
- Teachers are asked to come to this meeting for additional details.
- Team members are notified to gather information necessary to complete the Coded Adapted Facts sections 1-6.

## Tier 2 Criteria Measures

The purpose of this agenda item is to identify struggling students who have not been nominated for intervention. Simply put, it is a screening process to identify who may benefit from a Tier 2 intervention.

Social, Emotional, Academic Support Checklist

- Our Data Collectors present information on students in the at-risk/high risk categories of our existing school data.
- If data indicates the student is at risk in 2-3 areas we discuss possible interventions with the classroom teacher.



### Tier 2 SAEBERS

Embedded within the SEAS document you will see SAEBERS. This is an additional research support tool we use to screen for behavioral and emotional risk.

Teachers fill this screening out 2 times per year.




## **Tier 2 Current Interventions**

Tier 2 does not always mean CICO. We make available many different intervention strategies available for kiddos who need that extra support.



Our meeting agenda always includes carefully looking at all of our students on these interventions to insure it is what is most effective for them.





## **Tier 2 Current Interventions**

Students on Check In Check Out set daily goals with their mentor. Data acquired from their CICO sheet are carefully monitored at meetings at least once a month. Intervention adjustments are driven from this information with a student's progressive success our focal point.

### **Tier 2 Interventions**

The most important intervention begins in the classroom with the 8 Effective Teaching and Learning Practices. Some of those interventions may include after school tutoring or planned breaks.

Depending on the student and circumstances we look at the following Tier 2 interventions for both academics and behavior:

Social Skills Groups

1:1 Mentor





- Three of our Tier 2 members make up our Tier 3 Team. All team members have Tier 3 training and professional development specific to this tier.
- Each student identified for Tier 3 will have an action team. This action team will consist of Tier 3 members, teachers, counselors and administration in close contact with the student.
- Currently BES has one student on Tier 3 and one being closely monitored with a plan geared towards Tier 3.
- We feel our low Tier 3 numbers are due to our ability to quickly identify students for Tier 2, who benefit from additional interventions and supports.



• Students who have been identified for Tier 3 are typically not responding well to the Tier 2 intervention, or as a team we decided that Tier 3 would benefit this student more than a Tier 2 intervention like CICO.



- As a tier 2/3 advanced team you will continue to fill out the Adapted Facts sections 7A-9
- Section 7A: Conduct interviews with teachers, parents and student. This will also be redone for a student who has been on a Tier 2 support and is not responsive to that support.
  - Adapted Facts



#### After interviews are completed:

- You will complete the rest of the sections in Part B.
  - These sections dive deeper into the antecedents and consequences that were listed in part A.
  - You are drilling down to determine what the function of the behavior is.
  - You must complete observations in multiple areas for this student to determine if your function is correct so that you are putting in place the correct interventions.
