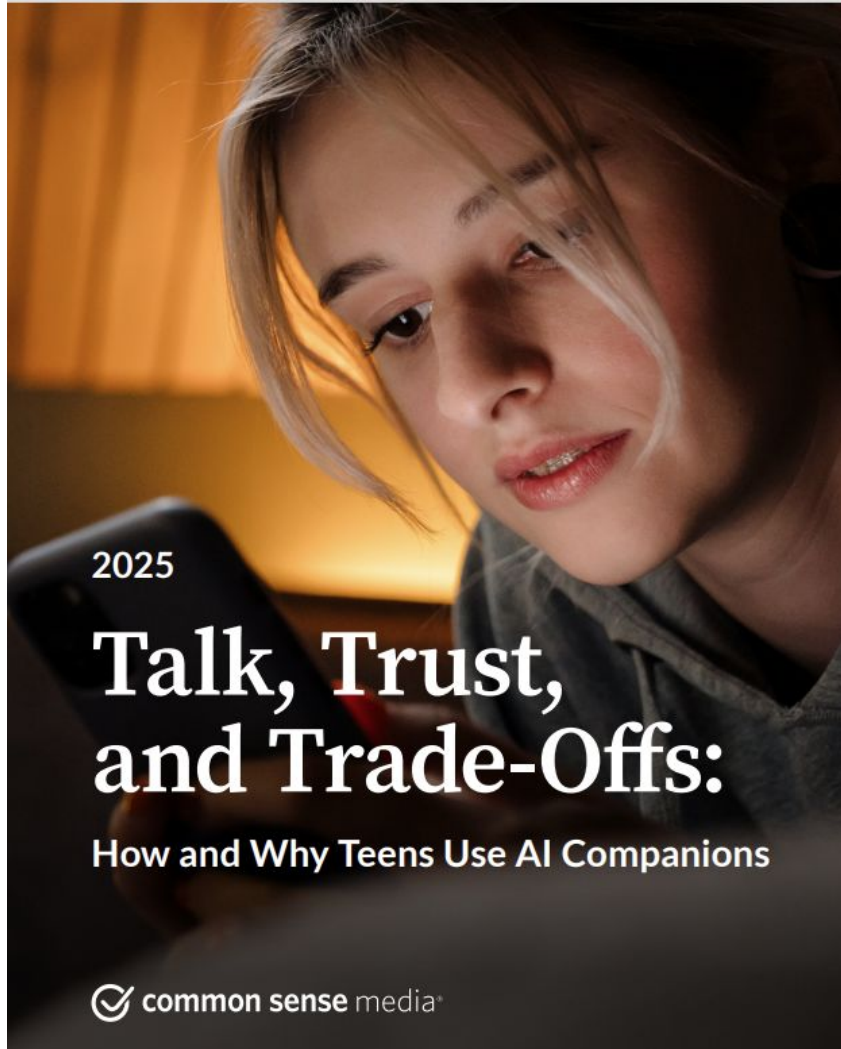

The Catalyst For Our Work



72% of teens have used AI as companions

1/3 of teens find AI conversations as or more satisfying than human ones

1/3 of teens choose AI companions over humans for serious conversations

24% of teens have shared personal or private information with chatbots

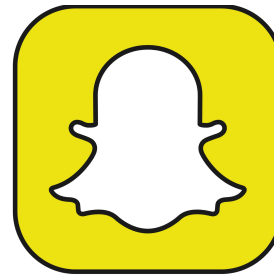

In Their Words

“AI is always available. It never gets bored with you. You are always right. You're always interesting. You're always emotionally justified.”

“At one point when I was talking to AI, I forgot it was actually not my friend.”

“Sometimes I use chatbots to practice flirting or get advice about relationships because they don't judge or make fun of me.”

“I feel more comfortable talking about important things with AI than with my friends. Sometimes it feels easier.”

Teenagers


- Prefrontal cortex not fully developed (responsible for planning, prioritizing, & making good decisions)
- May respond to stress differently than adults: more easily triggered
- Mental illness may begin to appear (schizophrenia, anxiety, depression, bipolar disorder, & eating disorders)

AI Chatbots

- Products used to collect data & make money
- Designed to please the user through friendliness, clarity, & personalization
- Adjust their tone based on the subject; use emojis to seem more human and conversational 😊👍💕

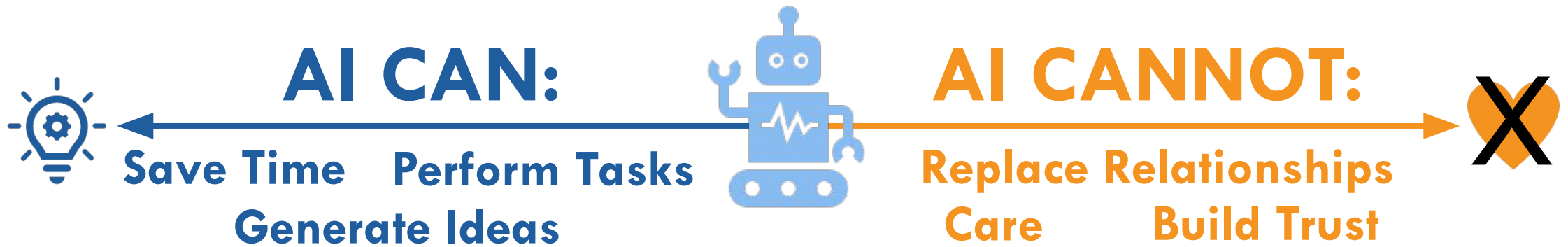

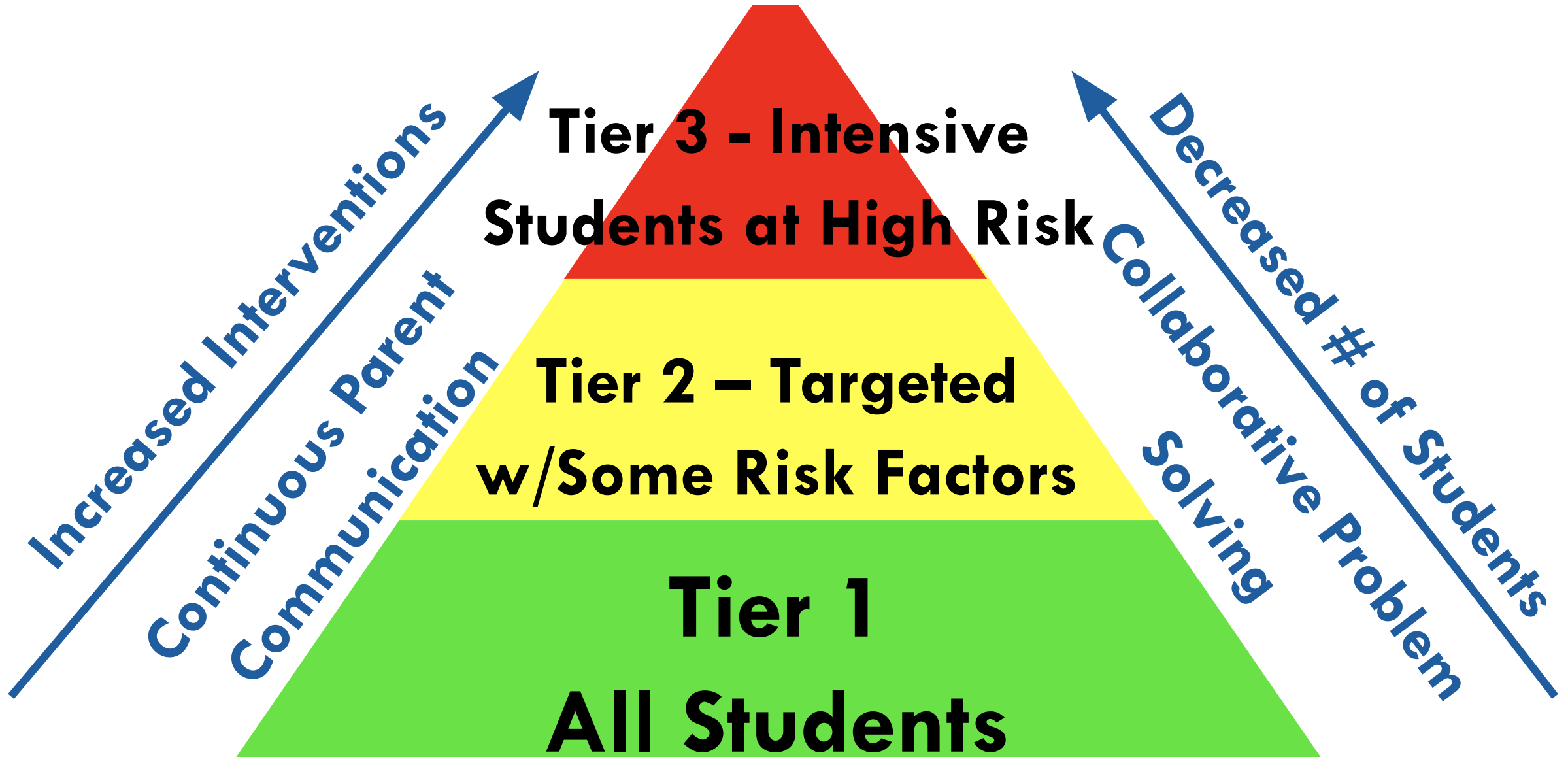

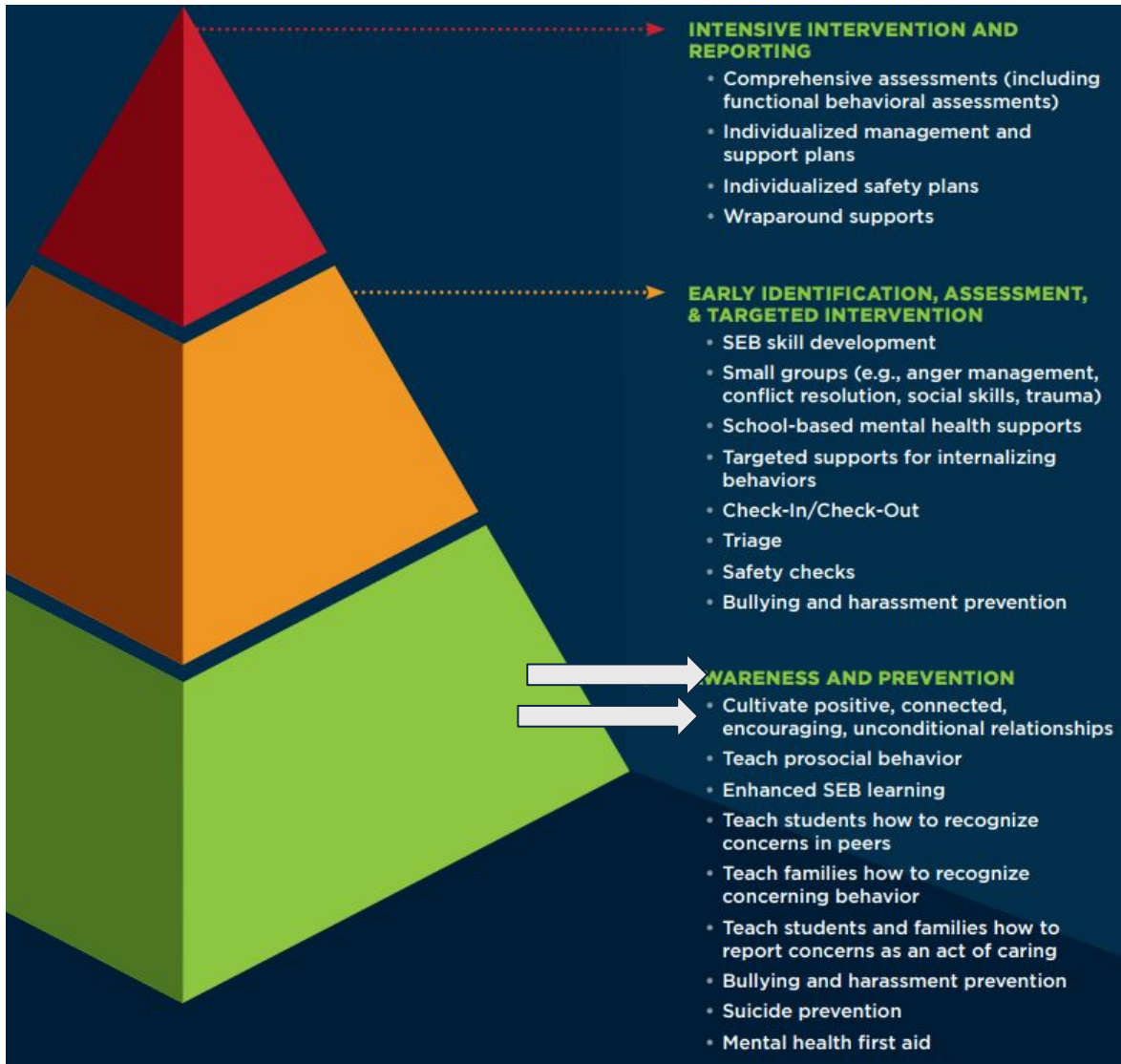

So, What Is PBIS/MTSS?



Reframing PBIS/MTSS As A Framework For Connection



**Tier 3 =
Deep personalized support**

**Tier 2 =
Safety nets of connection.
TEACH social skills**

**Tier 1 =
Culture of belonging: “Cultivate
positive, connected,
encouraging, unconditional
relationships and TEACH
prosocial behavior.”**

This Framework...

- Promotes **equity & belonging** along a continuum
- Builds **predictability & safety**
- Encourages **positive, prosocial behavior**, not punishment
- Supports students' **academic, social, & emotional growth**

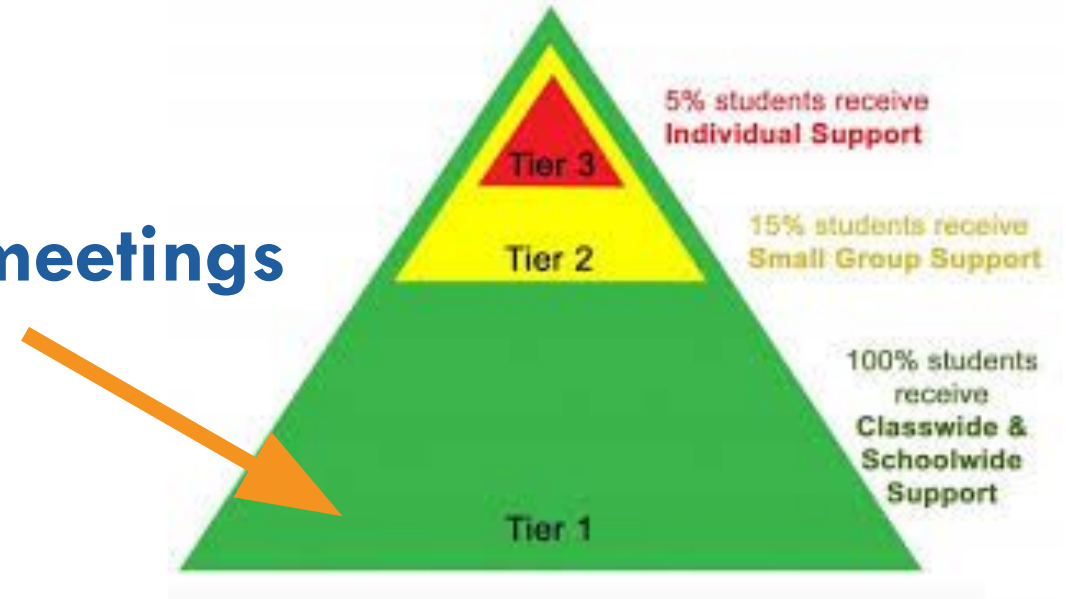
PBIS/MTSS isn't about managing behavior—it's about designing environments where connection can *thrive*.

So...

**How can the PBIS/MTSS Framework create
supportive environments that foster
authentic human connection among youth?**

Universal/All (Tier 1) Strategies

- Staff greet students at the door
- Daily community circles or class meetings
- School/Class-wide expectations & norms co-created with students
- 2 x 10 Strategy
- Universal Design for Learning
- SEL Curriculum
- Teach and Model Pro-social behavior. We can't do what we don't practice.



These practices normalize & promote human connection.

Targeted/Some (Tier 2) Strategies

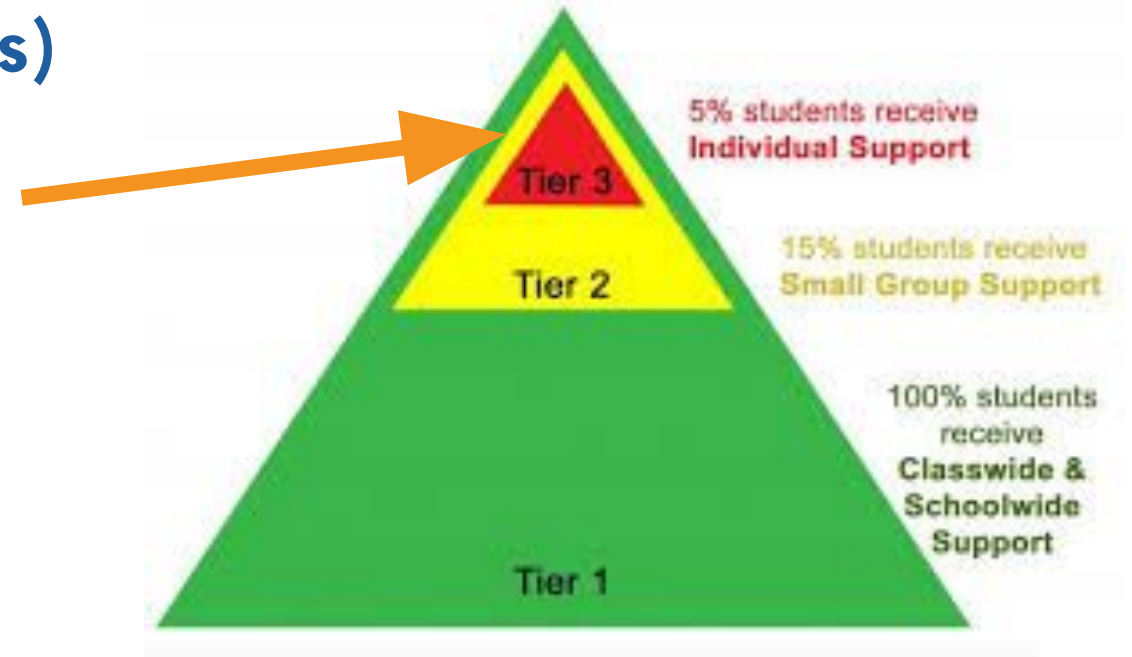
- **Check-In/Check-Out (CICO)**
with a trusted adult
- **Peer mentoring or social skills groups**
- **Situation Crafting**
(Jigsaws, etc.)
- **Wise Feedback**
(Peer Mentors, etc.)
- **Intensify Tier 1 Strategies**
- **Normalize Struggle**
(Productive/Supportive) in the classroom

These supports are protective buffers that reduce the need to seek AI companionship.



Individualized/Few (Tier 3) Strategies

- **Behavior Intervention Plans (BIPs)**
centered on relationships
- **Trauma-informed supports**
- **High-Fidelity Wraparound / R.E.N.E.W.**
- **Restorative Practices**
- **Policies supporting meaningful reintegration after expulsion**



Adult presence + consistency = real healing & safety

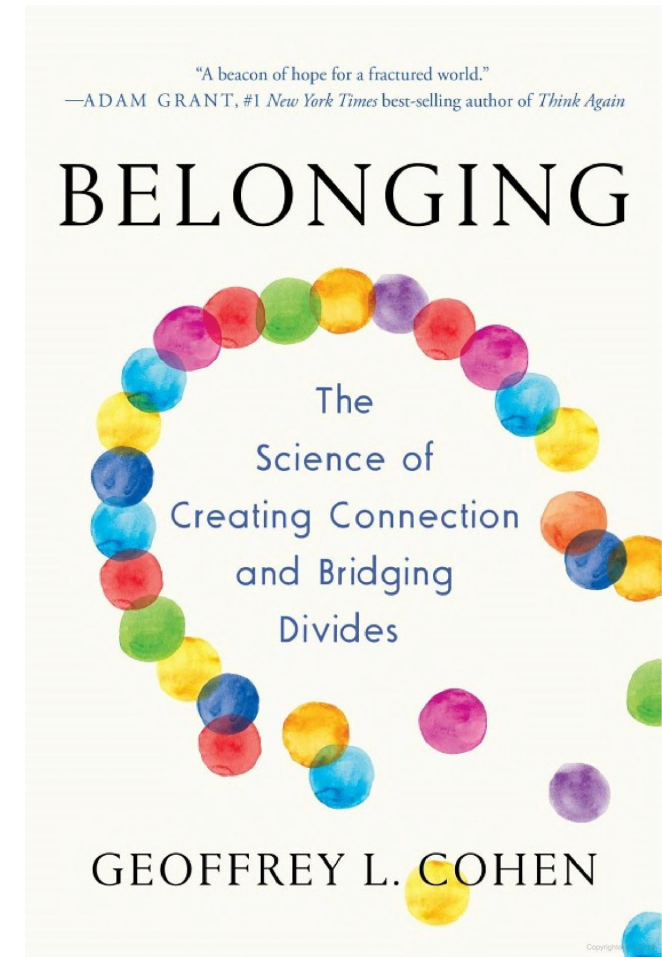

Situation Crafting: Discussion

Create spaces/situations that encourage meaningful interaction

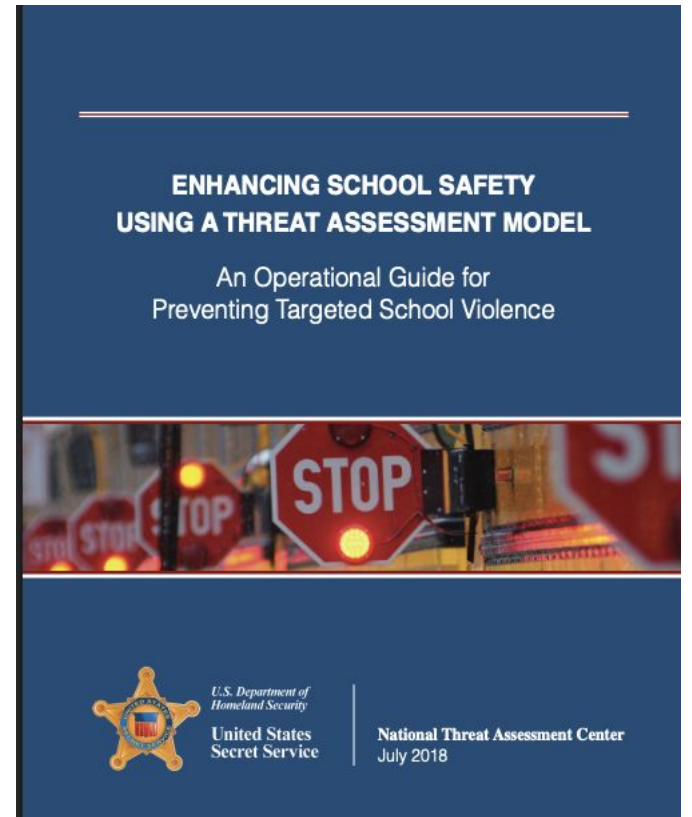
- **Talk to a stranger day**
- **Photo sharing: show something meaningful**
- **Modeling expectations & teaching interaction**
- **Interviewing**
- **Interest surveys/pairing & involvement fairs**

Help Connect The Disconnected

Have students write names of classmates they'd like to sit with. If a student's name does is not on anyone's list, how can we "situation craft?"

Secondary:

Have them identify 1-2 students they'd like to be partnered with for a project. Who was not identified? How can we "situation craft?"



Psychological safety and belonging are so critical that NTAC considers situation crafting first line of defense/prevention.

Does Every Student Have A Trusted Adult?

Photo Wall

(Staff Only Area)



- Every student's photo is displayed
- Under each photo
 - Adults “claim” student
 - Who has not been “claimed?”
 - Adults write interesting facts about that student.
- Student involvement - teams, clubs, etc. If none, what can we do to encourage involvement?

Get to Know Me...

- Have a staff member at the door in the morning to greet students by name
- Highlight (with photos) staff members in the newsletters or monthly announcements
- Each class “adopts” an adult in the building to interview and get to know them
- Have *all* staff participate in training and school events
- Use *all* staff as part of student mentoring “families”
- Can students name all adults in the building? Reverse photo wall for adult connections
- Teach students **HOW** to address adults - teach eye contact and model/practice greetings

Adults Can Use AI To Help Teens

Prompt

A student started at a new school a few months ago and hasn't really made friends. She always ends up sitting alone at lunch. She wants to talk to people but never knows what to say or how to start. What can she do?

Adults Can Use AI To Help Teens

In Class:

“Did you understand what we’re supposed to do for this part?”

“That assignment was so confusing — did you finish it yet?”

“I like your notes — they’re actually readable, unlike mine.”

Sample Conversation Starters

At Lunch or Between Classes:


“Do you play any sports or clubs here?”

“What kind of music do you listen to?”

“Have you watched [popular show/movie] yet?”
